

DISABILITY SERVICES

The following list includes links to organizations that provide services to disabled individuals, plus links to the organizations' volunteer pages, where available. The list includes non-profits and government agencies and descriptions summarized from information publicly available on organization websites at the time of posting or publishing. Programs may require background checks.



- [Bustin Barriers](#). Provides safe physical activities and meaningful socialization experiences for individuals with disabilities, creating opportunities for participants to have fun and strive toward their personal best. [Volunteers](#) assist with program and camp activities.

- [Clark County Volunteer Connections](#). Connects hundreds of individuals to volunteer service by working in partnership with over 200 community organizations. Opportunities available at places such as local Senior Centers, food pantries, youth and family oriented

programs, homelessness reduction programs, and hospitals, schools, nursing homes, and agencies that serve seniors, low-income families and kids, and emergency assistance.

- [Volunteer Connection Clackamas County](#). Links volunteers with social service programs that assist seniors, people with disabilities, residents lacking resources and others in need of social services.
- [Community Vision, Inc.](#) Offers a network of services, including supported living, home ownership, asset development, youth programs and employment services for disabled individuals. [Volunteers](#) are mentors, provide house painting, yard work, work parties, work special events.
- [Exceed Enterprises](#). Provides vocational and personal development services for people with disabilities. [Volunteers](#) work in offices, at events, provide services to disabled individuals.
- [Incight](#). Offers programs to help people with disabilities realize their potential and encourage inclusion. Supports and empowers key life aspects of education, employment, and independence. [Volunteers](#) help deliver programs and events.
- [Mt. Hood Kiwanis Camp](#). Partners with the U.S. Forest Service to provide individuals with disabilities an outstanding overnight recreational opportunity in the Mt. Hood National Forest. [Volunteers](#) help in work parties, at camps, in work parties and on projects and events.
- [Multnomah County Aging, Disability and Veterans Services](#). Serve older adults (age 60 and older), people with disabilities age 18 and older, and veterans. - [Oregon Disability Sports](#). Provides and promotes recreational, fitness and competitive opportunities for people with physical disabilities. [Volunteer](#) at numerous tournaments, events and practices.
