

FOOD BANKS AND GARDENS

The following list includes links to food pantries, organizations that supply fresh food, and links to the organizations' volunteer pages, where available. The list includes non-profits and government agencies and descriptions summarized from information publicly available on organization websites at the time of posting or publishing. Programs may require background checks.



- [Clark County Food Bank Garden](#). Farming program increases the amount of fresh, nutritious food distributed through 29 partner agencies across Clark County. [Volunteers](#) pull weeds, plant seeds, harvest fresh produce, lead groups of volunteers, work in food bank. Vancouver.
- [Clark County Food Bank](#). Regional food bank that distributes 6 million pounds of food and 5 million meals a year. Partners with 34 local agencies and programs. [Volunteers](#) drive a refrigerated truck, sort perishable food, and harvest vegetables on the farm. Vancouver.
- [Growing Gardens](#). Volunteers build organic vegetable gardens at homes, schools and correctional facilities. Gives low-income residents resources and education they need to grow their own food. [Volunteers](#) build garden beds, lead teams, work with home gardener, present workshops, conduct nutrition education, mentor youth clubs and serve as classroom assistants. Portland NE.
- [Multnomah County CROPS](#). Community farm donates harvests to the Oregon Food Bank. [Volunteer information](#). Troutdale.
- [Oregon Food Bank](#). Works with a cooperative network of partner agencies to distribute emergency food to hungry families. Also involved in public policy advocacy, nutrition, and garden education and improving community food systems. [Volunteers](#) repackage food, leading nutrition education classes, maintain learning gardens, help in offices, work at events, and more!
- [Portland Food Project](#). Collects food donations from long-term, regular food donors from neighborhood volunteers and distributes to 19 food pantries. [Volunteer information](#).
- [Portland Fruit Tree Project](#). Registers fruit-growers throughout the area to make it available to the needy. [Volunteers](#) participate in harvests, community outreach and fruit monitors.
- [St. Johns Food Share](#). Provides food to low-income residents of Portland, OR, and the surrounding area. Members pay \$30, volunteer and visit twice a week to select food. [Volunteer information](#).
- [Sunshine Pantry Sunshine Pantry](#). Provides food, amenities, housewares and clothing to people in need, in Beaverton, Tigard, Hillsboro, and Forest Grove. [Volunteers](#) load and unload, stock shelves.
