- [African American Health Coalition](#). Alliance of individuals, agencies, and organizations that addresses health issues faced by African Americans. [Volunteers](#) participate in Annual Village health fair, Soul Stroll health walk, daily operations, programs and events, interviews, newsletters and blogs, mailings, filing and data entry.
- [Clackamus Health Clinics](#). County healthcare organization providing primary care, prenatal, dental, mental health. [Volunteer](#) information.
- [Clackamas Volunteers in Medicine - The Founders Clinic](#). Free clinic services provided by medical and non-medical volunteers. [Medical volunteers](#) are credentialed doctors, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, nurses, and allied health professionals. Non-medical volunteers are involved with patient advocacy, administrative support, patient contact, translation, technology, communication, building maintenance and upkeep, fundraising and events; serve on boards and committees. - [The Dental Foundation of Oregon](#). Direct care and oral health education to underserved children on the Tooth Taxi free mobile dental clinic. [Volunteers](#) are dentists, hygienists and dental assistants who enjoy working with children.
- [Good News Community Health Center](#). Faith- and community-based health center offers primary care, diabetes education, foot care and mental health counseling at Rockwood-based clinic. [Volunteers](#) perform medical care and administration. Portland, SE.
- [Mercy and Wisdom Community Health Clinic](#). Serves uninsured and low income populations with primary care, acupuncture and Chinese medicine. [Volunteers](#) are directors, managers, professionals in healthcare, technology, and fundraising, landscapers and office workers. Portland SE.
- [North by Northeast Community Health Center](#). Free health screening and basic medical services to medically under-served with priority to African Americans and low-income. [Volunteers](#) are clinicians, nurses, medical assistants, office workers, and gardeners; help with special projects.
- [Project Access NOW](#). Connects low-income uninsured to donated primary and specialty care providers, hospitals, clinics and other organizations, pays premiums, with transportation care seats, and temporary housing. [Volunteers](#) help at events, assist in the office, serve on committees.
- [Ronald McDonald House](#). Provides a "home away from home" for families with seriously ill children, and supports initiatives to improve pediatric health. [Volunteers](#) work with families inside the house, at special events, in leadership roles or in the community.



- [Southwest Community Health Center](#). A safety-net-clinic providing basic health care to low-income uninsured. [Volunteers](#) provide clinical care and non-clinical support, Spanish interpretation. Hillsboro, Portland SW.
- [Virginia Garcia Memorial Health Center](#). Provides primary health care to migrant and seasonal farm workers and others with barriers to receiving healthcare in Washington and Yamhill Counties. [Volunteers](#) assist medical teams in mobile clinic and outreach.
- [Wallace Medical Concern](#). Provides neighborhood-based health care services and assistance for at multiple locations in East Multnomah County and the metro area. [Volunteers](#) include licensed medical providers, and those in non-medical tasks.

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
